

MEETING SUMMARY Key Highlights of JCC Co-Chairs Meeting: June 5, 2023

The Joint Collaborative Committees (JCC) Co-Chairs Committee meetings provide a forum for cross-committee discussion, to promote strategic alignment with JCC Principles, advance core committee mandates and to provide oversight, direction and create alignment on shared initiatives.

Through leadership from each organization (Doctors of BC and the Ministry of Health), the Physician Services Committee (PSC) provides guidance, monitors the activities, and oversees the work of the JCCs.

The PSC and Doctors of BC Board approved <u>3 Year JCC Aligned</u> <u>Strategic Plan</u> has identified the following focus areas: (1) Strengthen JCC alignment processes to create capacity for the JCCs to address emerging issues; (2) Align JCC Physician Leadership offerings across the committees; (3) Alignment of Priority Populations; and (4) Implement a cross JCC measures system across the committees.

Greetings & Gratitude

The JCC co-chairs welcomed Drs Jason Kur and James Card as the newly appointed respective SSC and JSC physician co-chairs. The table thanked departing co-chairs Drs Ahmer Karimuddin and Alan Ruddiman for their contributions to the JCCs.

Measuring the Impact of JCCs

An overview on the JCC Measurement initiative was provided as one of a set of measures to support the accountability requirement outlined by the Physician Services Committee (PSC), the Doctors of BC Board and the Physician Master Agreement (PMA). Approval to form an advisory committee consisting of JCC physicians and Ministry of Health representatives from the committees was reached.

Indigenous Specific Anti-Racism and Cultural Safety

An update was provided on the engagement activities within the JCC Indigenous Specific Anti-Racism (ISAR) and Cultural Safety and Humility (CS&H) initiative. A total of 331 participants have attended experiential learning sessions this year. Five webinar sessions were completed by March 2023 and were attended by 245 participants.

Compassionate Leadership

Since February 23, 2023, 40 physicians have participated in the Compassionate Leadership Training.

IHI Aim Statements

A discussion on the IHI Aim Statement was initiated in response to a co-chair request to adopt the Quintuple Aim into the principles of the JCCs. Since 2011, the JCCs have followed the IHI Triple Aim, with the incorporation of improving provider experience, however, formal adoption of the Quadruple Aim was not made in the recent PMA.

The JCCs decided to adopt the Quintuple Aim and will explore the identification of health equity outcomes and measures.

JCC Alignment of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion

The co-chairs are supportive of aligning the work of Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) across the JCCs.

It was approved to survey current JCC EDI work that is underway to avoid duplication across Doctors of BC and the JCCs.

JCC Communications – JCC Website and Branding

Marisa Adair presented the benchmark member engagement survey results, which included questions around the JCC brand, with approximately 25% of survey respondents were not sure of what JCC programs do for physicians.

As we move forward with the re-brand, communications will examine how to raise awareness of the JCCs initiatives, and the projects associated with them.

Advancing Alignment- Purpose to Practice Workshop

On June 5th, the co-chairs participated in a Purpose to Practice (P2P) workshop facilitated by consultant Valerie Nicol. Each committee highlighted short- and long-term priorities, and what enables or hinders their work.

It was suggested that the co-chairs focus on working together to improve common areas of work (e.g., maternity, digital health, and mental health) by bringing discussions and ideas to the JCC co-chairs meetings.
